### Refreshments:

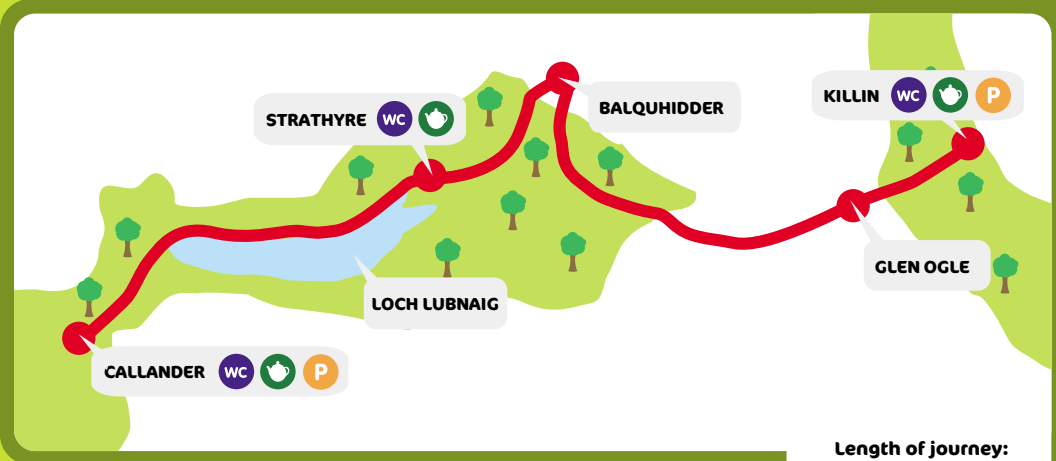
Pack plenty of refreshments to enjoy en-route. Cafés in Callander, Strathyre and Killin.

## Callander to Killin

You begin this ride in the centre of Callander and head north, following the River Garbh Uisge upstream through the forest of Strathyre. Here the river runs swiftly as it makes its way through this swathe of forest and thunders over the Falls of Leny. The Pass of Leny is an ancient entrance to the Highlands.

Continuing through the forest, you will cycle along the shores of Loch Lubnaig. Please note that half way along there is a short section of zig-zag slopes and rough surfaces. After leaving the loch's shores, you will be able to take a well deserved break at Strathyre. As well as shops and restaurants, there is also a Forest Centre here, which provides toilets and a picnic area.

It is then only three miles along a minor road to the village of Balquhiddy, where you can visit Rob Roy's grave, a folk hero and Scotland's own Robin Hood. This is a beautiful village with great views westwards along Loch Vail.

### Who'd enjoy this ride?

Families with older children and individuals, as the terrain can be steep and there are a couple of short on-road sections.
