So what's the reason behind our nostalgic tech obsession? A massive 78% say they love how old-school gadgets let them escape the constant buzz of their phones. Meanwhile, 79% find retro tech comforting as it takes them straight back to their childhood.

A massive 89% of gamers love that retro gaming gives them a break from the internet, and almost three quarters (74%) think nostalgic games are just so much more relaxing. 77% of us who hang on to retro tech say they do so as it has sentimental value.

The nostalgia trend shows no sign of slowing down with #nostalgia amassing over 11 million posts on Tik Tok², many featuring gadgets and games from the 1990s and 2000s.
